What are the essential, affectionate experiences between fathers and sons needed for healthy development? How do they appear as transferences in psychotherapy and psychoanalysis, and how can we optimize their therapeutic action? Dr. Perault will draw on recent advances in contemporary psychoanalysis -- from self psychology, infant observation, attachment research, and studies in the psychology of men -- to answer these questions and explore the often-overlooked potential of "affectionate transferences" to activate growth and develop new psychic structure.



Peter Z. Perault, M.D. practices adult psychiatry and psychotherapy in Chapel Hill. He directs the MindPlay series of psychoanalytic discussions at Playmakers Repertory Company, and teaches on the faculty of the Psychoanalytic Education Center of the Carolinas and the department of psychiatry at Duke. He is president-elect of the North Carolina Psychoanalytic Society.

Directions: Lucy Daniels Foundation (LDF) is located at 9001 Weston Parkway in Cary, NC. From I-40, take exit 287, Cary/Harrison Avenue. Proceed toward Cary on Harrison Avenue, approximately one-half mile. Turn right onto Weston Parkway and travel for 1.5 miles. The LDF is across the median on the left. Continue driving another 0.1 mile and make a U-turn at the median break to return to the LDF, now on your right. After turning into the LDF drive, you may park alongside the building or in the upper parking lot. (The LDF is located in the end of the building closer to Weston Parkway; the section of the building housing the Lucy Daniels Center for Early Childhood is at the far end, closer to the upper parking lot.)
