Expanding the Domain: Privacy, Secrecy, and Confidentiality

Presented By

Kerry Kelly Novick and Jack Novick, PhD

In this paper, Jack and Kerry Novick examine the values analysts use to define basic aspects of the treatment. With clinical data from analyses of adolescents, they consider the roles of privacy, secrecy and confidentiality in treatment. Child and adolescent analysis, because of the necessary involvement of parents, offers a laboratory to examine assumptions and question conventional views of how clinicians use information with adults and children. Considering a hierarchy of clinical values, the Novicks find application to fundamental issues such as defining the goals of treatment and to technical choices that affect formation of the therapeutic alliance, termination criteria, and the roles of action and reality in clinical work.

Jack Novick and Kerry Kelly Novick are child, adolescent and adult psychoanalysts on the Faculties of the



Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute, the Michigan Psychoanalytic Council, the New York University Psychoanalytic Institute, the Chicago Center for Psychoanalysis, the Tampa Psychoanalytic Institute, the Southeast Florida Institute for Psychoanalytic Psychology, the North Carolina Psychoanalytic Institute, the Seattle Psychoanalytic Institute, and the New York Freudian Society, where they are both Training and Supervising Analysts. They trained with Anna Freud in London, England, and, in addition to their clinical work, have been active in teaching, research, and the community. They joined other colleagues to found the award-winning non-profit psychoanalytic school, Allen Creek Preschool, in Ann Arbor,

linked to the Lucy Daniels Center through the non-profit international Alliance for Psychoanalytic Schools.

Jack Novick is currently Adjunct Clinical Associate Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Michigan and Wayne State Medical Schools and in private practice in Ann Arbor. He is Chair of the Program Evaluation Committee at Allen Creek Preschool, where he is also a Family Consultant. He is the past Chair of the Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute's Child and Adolescent Psychoanalysis training program.

Kerry Kelly Novick was Lecturer in Psychoanalysis at the University of Michigan Medical School, is now Senior Consultant to Allen Creek Preschool, and is in private practice in Ann Arbor. She is past President of the Association for Child Psychoanalysis and currently Chair of the Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute's Child and Adolescent Psychoanalysis training program.

Both Jack and Kerry Novick have written extensively on topics of defense, termination, development, verbalization, sadomasochism, therapeutic alliance, and omnipotence. Their book "Fearful Symmetry: The Development and Treatment of Sadomasochism" appeared in 1996 and was re-issued in paperback in 2007. "Working with Parents Makes Therapy Work," also translated into German, Finnish, and Italian, appeared in March 2005. A volume on termination, called "Good Goodbyes," was published in March 2006. Forthcoming are books on "Freedom to Choose: Two Systems of Self-Regulation," "Building Emotional Muscle," and "Becoming an Adult."

Directions: Lucy Daniels Foundation (LDF) is located at 9001 Weston Parkway in Cary, NC. From I-40, take exit 287, Cary/Harrison Avenue. Proceed toward Cary on Harrison Avenue, approximately one-half mile. Turn right onto Weston Parkway and travel for 1.5 miles. The LDF is across the median on the left. Continue driving another 0.1 mile and make a U-turn at the median break to return to the LDF, now on your right. After turning into the LDF drive, you may park alongside the building or in the upper parking lot.
